- 1. What are the twelve qualities that a good supervisor must acquire/possess as discussed in this course before helshe can function as a role model to those he/she supervises?
- 2. Edward W. Blyden (1901) once lamented that the precise problem of the African is to develop his(her) power as an African. He was also of the opinion that the African youth should be brought up to assume his(her) future leadership roles that would make him(her) to be **the companion**, **the equal**, **the comrade** of the whiteman; and **not** his perpetual **imitator**, his **ape**, his **parasite**, who with his(her) feelings of incompetence within his fettered and unliberated mind, keeps on consciously or unconsciously to imbibe the conviction that "to be a great man, he(she) must be like the white-man". Megaforce (2003) was also worried about the future role of the African child in the committee of nations when he said that "with the perpetuation of renigrade regimes in Africa that are manned by demented kleptocrats, egoists and misanthropes who are mainly rulers and not leaders... and the type of rulers who are not only unpatriotic but exhibits traces of buffoonery in his(her) thinking processes leading a passive populace, the rise of the Blackman to the technologically active zone could have been postponed indefinitely.
